Wind and solar has a place in energy production but, our energy usage goes up at night just as the sun sets & wind power is variable and inconsistent.


We need a method of storage such as hydro for example where solar is used to pump water up hill during the day and then hydro used at night. A 'battery' if you will.

We all know that predictions and forecasts are almost 100% wrong, with very few exceptions. Covid reminded us of the fallibility of 'experts'.


What if climate change was being used as an excuse for control and that carbon is a taxable commodity, essential to establish that control.
