In the other four Counties, a mix of Full Council elections of just a third of seats up for re-election.

Across these four Counties we have a total of 70 candidates. You can check you Council website after 5pm on 5h April to see if there is one where you live.

Thank you to everyone who is standing for us.

If you feel that standing for Council in May 2025, is some

thing you would like to do. Please let me know after the 2nd May. Thanks.

Reform UK Councillors are not whipped, which means as a Reform UK Councillor.

You can represent your neighbourhood in a way that is right for the Residents, not the Party. For more information, please contact me after 2nd May 2024.

Ben Habib and June Mummery came to Norwich to speak in front of a packed room.

Look out for more of these local events in coming months, with a big Eastern Region event in early July.

Unfortunately, a couple of our Eastern Region PPCs have had to withdraw for personal reasons, one seat already re-allocated, we welcome Scott Hussey to Bury St Edmund and Stowmarket.

At this point we have 49 of the 61 seats in the Region allocated and people being processed for more of them. I am confident that by the

time the General election is called, all 61 will have a PPC waiting for your vote and ready to represent your needs and wishes in the House of Commons.

Bedfordshire County Overview

Bedfordshire PPCs

Bedfordshire is a local election free zone this year, with just the Police and Crime Commissioner election occurring.

With our focus being on the general election later in the year it hasn't been possible for us to field a candidate for the Bedfordshire PCC election.

I am not convinced that the PCC even needs to exist or adds any value for tax payers. The position is just another layer of unnecessary cost with no measurable benefit whatsoever.

I certainly don't feel safer since the introduction of PCCs, I haven't seen more police on our streets and I haven't seen crime fall.

Across Bedfordshire lots is going on. In Luton South Norman has delivered over 25,000 leaflets so far, in Dunstable and Leighton Buzzard constituency Harry has delivered 35,000 leaflets so far.

Harry is holding a public Reform UK meeting in Dunstable and Leighton Buzzard constituency. On **Monday, the 6th May at 6-15pm**, St Leonard's Church hall, Leighton Road, Heath and Reach, LU7 0AA.

Harry will be joined by Noel Willcox, our Hemel Hempstead PPC who is rapidly becoming famous for fighting £11,000 in ULEZ fines and winning. Also speaking will be Noel Matthews, Reform UK National Organiser and the man behind the candidates who will happily tell you about the progress the party is making, and what to expect later in the year as we head towards the general election.

Public meetings are a great opportunity to get to know Harry and the rest of Reform UK.

Looking forwards, all our candidates will be out canvassing all spring and summer in readiness, as well as holding more events, street stalls and more.

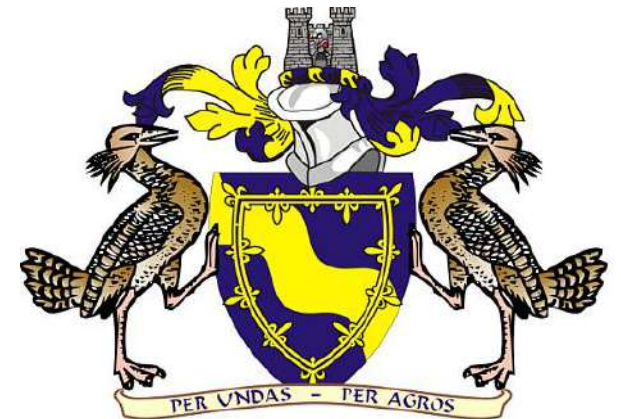

Herts County Council Feel the Effects of People Power!

Well, if you ever thought the barons of local government cared about the views of their constituents, I've got some sad news for you. Our petition for the cancellation of Hertfordshire County Councils deranged roll out of 20mph zones, predictably, fell on deaf ears at County Hall.

John Dowdle (PPC for St Albans) was given only 3 minutes to present the 1500 signatures to the Transport Committee, he spoke of the obscene waste of money for something that the people of Hertfordshire clearly didn't want and was rudely cut off at the end.

The Councillor chairing the meeting was dismissive in the extreme and the Committee "decided" to acknowledge the petition but that no further action would be taken. That's right. No further action taken.

When 1500 people in two weeks say NO they pretend not to hear! But fear not, this issue is not going away and Reform UK councillors and PPC's across the county are going to campaign on scrapping this unpopular act.

The Tories, Labour, Lib Dem's and the Greens are all marching in lockstep and rolling out the anti-motorist measures and we will stand firmly against them.

The policy is unworkable and pretty much unenforceable. Some are suggesting that shortly after 20mph signs go up, speed cameras will surely follow, milking more money out of motorists. It's hard to image something more ridiculous than getting a fine for driving at 24mph!

In other news Herts Reformers are gearing up for the local elections. We have District and Borough elections happening across St Albans, Harpenden, Watford, Stevenage and East Herts.

With roughly 30 Reform candidates lined up, we've practically doubled our local representation!

We currently only have one constituency in need of a suitable candidate.

Norfolk County Overview

Norfolk (/ˈnɔːrfək/ NOR-fək) is a ceremonial county in the East of England and East Anglia. It borders Lincolnshire and The Wash to the north-west, the North Sea to the north and east, Cambridgeshire to the west, and Suffolk to the south. The largest settlement is the city of Norwich.

The county has an area of 2,074 sq mi (5,370 km²) and a population of 859,400. It is largely rural with few large towns: after Norwich (147,895), the largest settlements are King's Lynn (42,800) in the north-west, Great Yarmouth (38,693) in the east, and Thetford (24,340) in the south. For local government purposes Norfolk is a non-metropolitan county with seven districts.

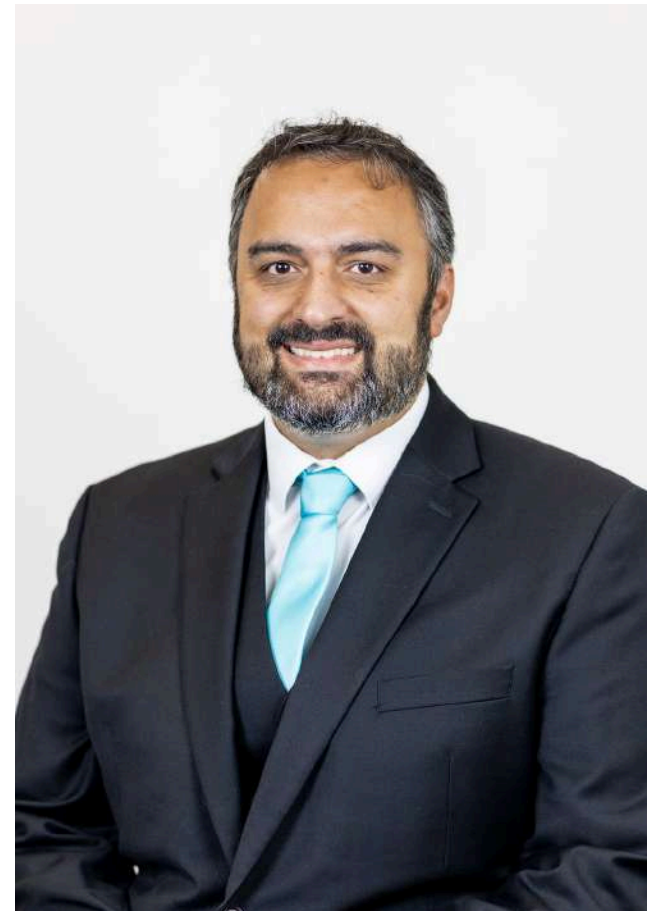
In my search for a new political home I found Reform UK.

The Welfare State & Open Borders Cannot Coexist

Our welfare state was not designed for the world we have been forced to live in today.

We have a National Health Service that is being treated like an International Health Service.

We have a situation where our public services are being used on a massive scale by millions of people who have not contributed towards them. That is not a condition of the social contract that tax payers agreed to, hence the high level of discontent amongst the public.

Our welfare state has always struggled to deliver a minimum level of service, even 20 years ago, when the population was 12 million smaller than it is today. The burden on taxpayers has always been onerous, but today, with our open border policy that was brought in by Tony Blair's Labour party and has been actively encouraged by the Tories since 2010, the cost of welfare is spiralling out of control.

Their plan was simple; more people mean a larger economy and more money for all, but that isn't what has happened. Instead of that somewhat misguided pipedream, a different reality has come to pass.

The dream we were sold as the public was that we would be importing all of those essential skills that we are lacking as a country, doctors, nurses, scientists, etc. While we have indeed imported some of them, which introduces all sorts of moral dilemmas in the process; why do we think it is ok to deprive developing nations of their highly trained people instead of training our own?

Before anyone says but Brits don't want to do those jobs, I would say, that is untrue. In 2022 we accepted 7,500 doctors onto our doctor training programme. Limited by the BMA (a socialist health union), out of a total of 38,000 applications. We could be training Brits to be our doctors if the BMA got out of the way and allowed us to do so.

So, we import doctors from developing nations, who bring their families with them, often extended families, who guess what, use our public services, they get old, they get ill. In many cases those dependents don't work. But they do use GPs, dentists, hospitals and schools. In some cases they require translation services in order to do so, driving the cost of service provision up further.

In many cases we are exacerbating the issue rather than solving it.

If the economy, or state pension, or health care, or welfare system doesn't work when you have a population of 56 million, who in their right mind would think the solution is a larger population, that our services will suddenly function at an acceptable level with more people requiring access?. A larger population just increases the problem.

Our entire economy is hung on the failure of our state pension. Until we redress the significant issues with retirement and how we fund it, we will not be able to balance the economy and afford to fund retirement.

Imagine if we invested each person's NI pension contributions instead of a teenage workers NI contribution paying Great Auntie Carole's monthly state pension.

Your pension would pay you around three times more than the current state pension.

The major challenge obviously is how we get from where we are today to a new investment fund pension model. We would have to fund the 40-year gap in funding shortfall for existing pensioners which clearly needs consideration.

But, back to our open borders and welfare and free healthcare free-for-all.

If anyone can come to the UK and plug into the gravy train as they seem to be able to do at present, we are never going to resolve the problems we face. Your queue for a GP will not get shorter, your scan for potential cancer will not happen faster, your toothache will not be treated promptly.

Defenders of asylum seekers say that they only get a few pounds a week each to live on, so if that is true, how come they each cost us £50k per year? Their combined 'package' vastly exceeds the package for the unemployed or on Universal Credit.

Additionally, asylum seekers somehow manage to jump the queue for GPs, dentists, housing, education, leaving the people who have paid into the system feeling angry and rightfully so...cont
