Bedfordshire PPCs

Bedfordshire campaigning activity is starting to gear up as the general election looms ever closer.

While it is looking likely to be later in the year in either October or November, it may possibly be a snap election in the spring so there is no time to waste.

In North Bedfordshire Nick has been busy. With a team of 10 volunteers he has already delivered 10,000 leaflets introducing himself and the party to North Beds residents.

In Luton North James has already delivered 3,500 leaflets as well as holding street stalls, so take the opportunity when you see him and stop to say hello. James is keen for more volunteers to get in touch.

Down in Luton South, Norman has delivered 8,500 leaflets so far with his volunteers. He has been receiving lots of support but if you can volunteer to help please do so.

In Dunstable & Leighton Buzzard, Harry has been very busy, with 30,000 leaflets already delivered and he is expecting to get 10,000 more done to complete his first lap of the constituency by the end of February.

Harry is in the process of organising a Reform UK guest speaker for an event in April.

You can also expect to receive a Reform UK survey through your door from Harry, when you do so, please complete and return.

In Bedford Constituency leafleting will begin in February with street stalls to follow. Follow Maggie's Facebook page for more information.

In Mid Bedfordshire we'll be delivering leaflet across the spring. We have been fortunate to find a great location for a large banner on the A6 so that will be going up in the spring too.

In Bedfordshire we have also invested in an advertising trailer which we are in the process of having branded. Expect to see it out and about throughout the year.

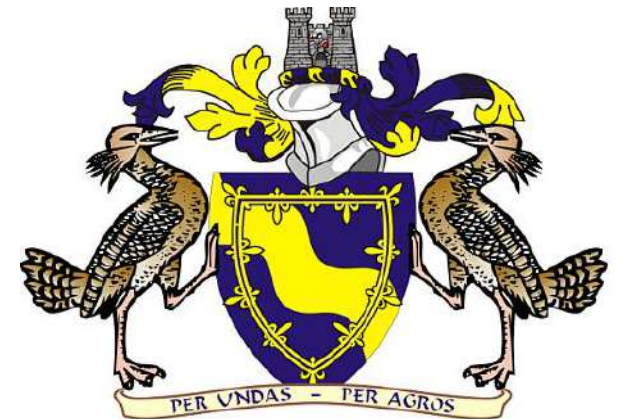

Hertfordshire Targeted for 20 mph Zones!

Eagle eyed John Dowdle (St Albans PPC) has spotted a move by Highways Chiefs in Hertfordshire to roll out a wave of unwanted and undemocratic 20mph zones. across the county!



Why I here you ask? To "improve road safety, create calmer streets and encourage more walking and cycling", according to Hertfordshire County Council.

What a load of rubbish! This we all know is part of the not-so-secret war on motorists occurring across the nation. And how much will this all cost? £2.3 million! That's according to the budget proposals for 2024/25.

You'd be forgiven for thinking the Lib Dems and Greens controlled HCC, but no, the Tories are pulling all the strings and have already spent £3 million on 20mph zones, with plans to waste a further £1.7 million in 2025.

That's £6 million of your council tax, splurged for Tory vanity. All said and done, we'll have more than 50 of these 20mph zones across the county.

Needless to say – we'll be fighting this in everyway we can. John Dowdle has started a petition against the measures and we'll be making this a key feature of our local campaigns. More details to follow soon!

Norfolk County Overview

Norfolk (/ˈnɔːrfək/ NOR-fək) is a ceremonial county in the East of England and East Anglia. It borders Lincolnshire and The Wash to the north-west, the North Sea to the north and east, Cambridgeshire to the west, and Suffolk to the south. The largest settlement is the city of Norwich.

The county has an area of 2,074 sq mi (5,370 km²) and a population of 859,400. It is largely rural with few large towns: after Norwich (147,895), the largest settlements are King's Lynn (42,800) in the north-west, Great Yarmouth (38,693) in the east, and Thetford (24,340) in the south. For local government purposes Norfolk is a non-metropolitan county with seven districts.

The west of Norfolk is part of the Fens, an extremely flat former marsh. The centre of the county is gently undulating lowland; its northern coast is an area of outstanding natural beauty, and in the south is part of Thetford Forest.

In the east are the Broads, a network of rivers and lakes which extend into Suffolk. The area is protected by the Broads Authority and has similar status to a national park. The geology of the county includes clay and chalk deposits, which make its coast susceptible to erosion.

Being in the far reaches of the Eastern Region, it is sometimes thought that we forget about Norfolk.

Norfolk is an integral part of the Eastern Region and as important as the other five Counties. It has taken a little longer than some to get the County moving forward and we are doing that now.

We have four of the nine seats allocated and more being processed.

SPOKESMAN SPOTLIGHT

Paul Godfrey - Brentwood & Ongar

I'm Paul Godfrey, Reform UK Prospective Parliamentary Candidate for Brentwood and Ongar.

I have lived in Brentwood most of my life, having moved here with my parents as a very young child. I have three children two dogs and one wife and up until a few years ago, was quite happy being left alone. More comfortable in the shadows than in the spotlight, standing as a political candidate had never been high on my "to do" list, but the last few years have been life changing for many people, myself included. Having spent far too long in the spring and summer of 2020 shouting at the television, for my own sanity I had to at least feel like I had an opportunity to make a difference.

Fast forward to Manchester, October 2021, and I found myself attending a candidate selection day and conference weekend. I had found a political party that shared many of my views, and I was on my way to becoming a Reform UK PPC. As a man who wanted to be left alone, this was not a decision made lightly.

Finding Reform UK meant that I was no longer politically homeless. My opinions and views on current affairs, politics and economics, forged during my years working in banking as a currency trader, were essentially conservative, but no longer Tory, and aligned, for the most part, with Reform.

I was on the trading floor in September 1992 when Britain was forced out of the contrived Exchange Rate Mechanism. Despite the massive transfer of wealth from the Central Banks to the elite currency speculators, the devaluation of the pound and the ability to fix our own interest rates meant that the UK emerged from recession ahead of its European counterparts.

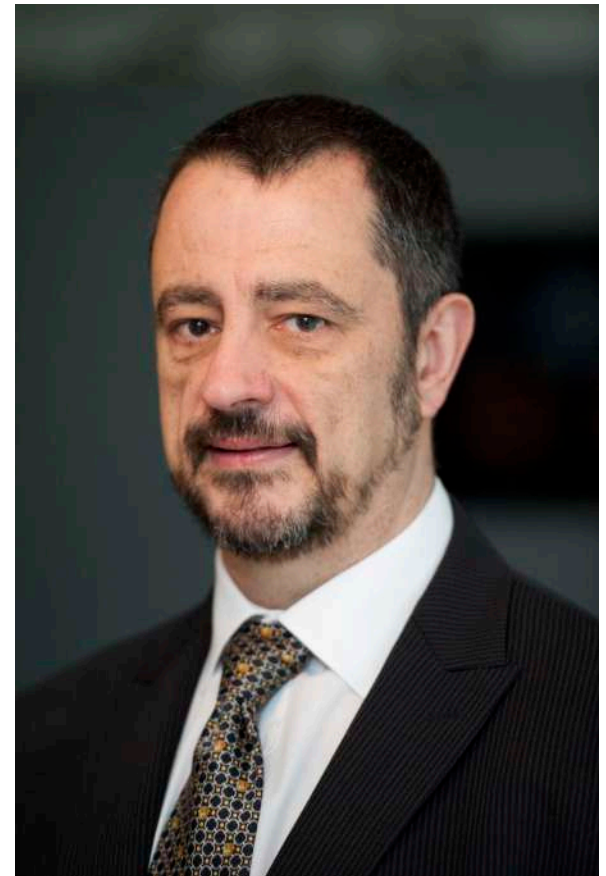
It should have been obvious then that we

were better off outside of a single currency and the constraints of the EU, but political will does not have to make economic sense, and the mad march towards Maastricht continued.

There is no perfect solution to the problems that the UK faces, but outside of the EU we can choose our own destiny, and with candidates that are more interested in raw authenticity than self-promotion, we stand out as the party that champions the commonsense rights of the British people.

The Peasants Revolt, which started in Brentwood in May 1381 was an uprising which spread across the southeast of the country with the rebels seeking a reduction in taxation, an end to serfdom and the removal of the King's senior officials and law courts.

Some 640 years later and low taxation, personal freedom, House of Lords reform and exiting the ECHR now make up our agenda. A change is definitely overdue.

Editors Rant

The Harsh Realities of Net Zero

The move away from fossil fuels to renewables has been ongoing since the first wind farm was installed in the UK in the early 1990's. From day one everyone has been aware of the intermittency issues and associated battery storage challenges.

There was no way that it could not have been known that the end point in order to make renewables work as a viable energy source would necessitate a complete redesign of our grid and energy supply network.

Renewables are not a natural solution but an expensive solution, mired in complexities that we have failed to get to grips with in any tangible form.

From their inception backing up renewable energy wasn't a concern. It was only as we began the process of decommissioning our coal fired power stations and our ageing nuclear installations that the storage issue loomed into the public's view.

The only way to proceed with a flawed technology despite the numerous red flags that have been waving for decades is to subsidise the market, creating artificial incentives to pursue the growth in the technology while simultaneously pushing much of that cost onto the unwitting public via stealth taxes.

We have created an artificial marketplace for energy generation where the rewards for building renewables are unviable, too expensive and unable to supply our energy needs.

Currently we require around 61 gigawatts per day of electricity in the UK (But, electricity is only 20% of our energy consumption). If we assume that in ten years' time, we will all be driving electric cars and have electric heat pumps installed, that consumption will need to be $5 \times 61 \text{ gigawatts} = 300 \text{ gigawatts}$.

In 2023 the UK's largest battery storage facility went live near Luton. At a cost of £30 million it can store up to 99 MWh. Ten of these

installations will thus be able to store 1 gigawatt per day. 610 of these installations will be able to store 61 gigawatts per day. 305 gigawatts per day will require 3,050 Battery storage installations at £30m each.

To be able to keep the lights on and charge these batteries ready for use we would require at least 610 gigawatts of generation per day, half to run the country, half to fill the batteries. If and when the wind doesn't blow, neither of those things will occur.

So let's assume those batteries are full at the end of day 1, on day two there is no wind so we use the stored electricity for the next 24 hours. On day three, if the wind doesn't pick up we will all be sat in the dark, or turn to diesel generators for emergency power.

It has been conservatively estimated that we would require battery storage capable of running the country for 14 days if we want to be able to cover the base load as we currently do.

The maths is therefore $3050 \text{ battery Storage installations} \times 14 \text{ (days)} \times £30\text{m} = £1.28 \text{ Trillion}$ to install (Based on current usage)

This assumes that we would have the renewables to charge these battery banks, and that the raw materials, minerals, lithium and cobalt exists to be able to manufacture them.

We would also need to rebuild the national grid to be able to handle the increase demand. Current estimates assume this would cost in the region of £90 billion. As we know estimates are always less than the subsequent spend aren't they?

Realistically, the sums above will be treble of quadruple as our electricity needs scale up and fossil fuel usage scales down.

Our government seem to believe that if we all have EV's that they can use them for our energy storage needs, but how is that going to work in real terms? We have already heard from people

who deplete their EV range just by defrosting it in winter and then don't have the range to get to work.

Imagine a world where we all have EV's plugged in being used by the government for load balancing. You get up to go to work only to discover that your EV overnight charge was needed and now you can't get where you need to go.

There are too many what ifs that have never been addressed. This seems to have been a project started on the principle that at some point new technology would arrive to enable its completion, despite all the evidence to the contrary.

It seems inconceivable that there will come a point when we don't need our gas power plants to fill in the generational black holes. Gas that we are increasingly importing from the US as LNG from US fracking. How can it be greener to ship gas that we have paid to liquify across the Atlantic in oil powered tankers than to produce our own domestically?

Estimates are that we will soon exhaust supplies of copper, rendering any attempts to deliver the required infrastructure as completely futile.

Factor in that the whole of the western world is simultaneously galloping towards the net zero cliff edge with boyish enthusiasm and competition for governments to deliver on their fanciful climate promises will drive up prices ever more.

Our leaders are attempting to move us to a world where we are reliant on renewable energy that can't meet our needs, on a network we can't afford to update to handle the theoretical capacity we need to generate but can't while storing it in giant batteries that will cost £ Trillions to build if the materials are available to do so.

It won't work and I believe that our leaders know that it can't work, I'm just not sure that they care if it does or not.
